

Handling Curved Film in 120 Film Holder

Problem Explanation



 When 120 film has been stored for a long time, it may become 'curved', as shown in the image below:



Problem Explanation




 If you try to place such film in 120 Film Holder, this condition often leads to difficulty in loading and can result in blurry scans at the raised portion in the middle of the film.



However, if you know the proper techniques for using the PIE 120 film holder, you can address the issue of curved film.

Introduction to 120 Film Holder





- When the lock on the Holder is in the unlocked position, the Lower magnetic film guide can move freely up and down.
- Conversely, when the lock is engaged, the Lower magnetic film guide will be fixed in place.

Step 1: Adjust the Gap of the Magnetic Film Guide





1. Adjust the lock to the unlocked position.



2. Push the Lower Magnetic Film Guide all the way up.




3. Adjust the lock to the locked position.

Step 2: Loading 120 film into the holder

Step 3: Adjusting the Holder to Fully Extend the 120 Film





Adjust the lock to the unlocked position.



2. Push the Lower Magnetic Film Guide gently downwards until the 120 Film is fully extended.



3. Adjust the lock to the locked position.
